



NON PRO SLOTS FOR THE 2025 FUTURITY HOW DO THEY WORK?

Slots are the term used to assign an entry in the Non Pro Division/Amateur of the Futurity, Derby and Classic Challenge. A Slot enables an entry to be made as the rider and not a particular horse (a named entry).

WHAT IS THE BENEFIT OF A SLOT OVER NAMING YOUR HORSE?

- You can change your mind which horse you want to ride in the non pro events
- The sale of a slot or named entry prior to the draw will attract a \$165.00 administration fee. The sale of a slot is negotiated between the seller and the buyer direct. The completed official sale form for the sale of the slot and the \$165.00 fee must be paid to the NCHA office to finalise the sale.
- Sale of slot or named entry after the draw will attract a \$330.00 fee. The buyer will be required to submit horse's registration papers or a bill of sale showing proof of ownership to the NCHA.
- When a Non Professional sells a slot after the draw they cannot re-purchase another slot in that class. They may however buy a horse from another Non Professional which is entered in that class and show the purchased horse in the slot which has been assigned to that horse.
- Slots need to be named prior to the draws being completed. You can, however, name your slot after the draws and prior to the commencement of the event, but this will attract a \$330.00 fee. All slots must be named at least one hour prior to the commencement of the event. If the slot is not named one hour prior to the event commencing, the entry will be scratched from the event.

THINGS THAT YOU CANNOT DO WITH A SLOT

- A slot cannot be transferred to the open divisions.
- Remember it is not a slot if you have named the horse and sent in registration papers (etc.) on the first nomination payment - if you name it at the second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth payment it is no longer a slot.
- Slots are only available for non-professional divisions, so you can only have a slot in the Non Pro/Amateur Futurity, Non Pro/Amateur Derby or the Non Pro/ Amateur Classic Challenge.
